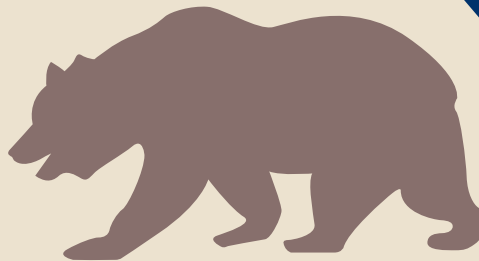

KNOW HOW YOUR LEGISLATOR IS VOTING FOR YOU

The following 2021 CSEA Voting Record shows how California State Senators and Assemblymembers voted on eight priority bills affecting classified school employees during the first half of the 2021-2022 Legislative Session.

These bills give a representative sample of votes in the California State Assembly and State Senate on issues such as public education, labor rights, and classified employee benefits. The voting records play a significant role in determining CSEA endorsements in legislative races.

LEGISLATIVE PROCESS

The California State Legislature is comprised of two houses, the State Assembly and the State Senate. The Assembly has a total of 80 members and the Senate has 40 members. Legislative Sessions run in two-year cycles. Approximately 5,000 bills are introduced during a two-year Legislative Session.

The legislative process requires most bills to pass through policy and fiscal committees in each house. The policy committees typically assess the merit of the proposed changes to existing law; whereas, the fiscal committee reviews the fiscal impacts that the proposed measure may have on the state. Once a bill passes out of these committees, it must also be voted on and passed out by the entire legislative body of each house.

A bill can take up to two years to move through the Legislature and reach the Governor's desk. Once before the Governor, a measure must be enacted into law or vetoed.

This process allows CSEA to carefully monitor if a legislator votes for or against classified school employees' interests.

HOW ARE LEGISLATORS SCORED?

CSEA selected eight priority bills to score each member of the Senate and the Assembly. These eight bills include our six sponsored bills and two other bills that impact classified employees and the labor movement. Legislators are given 100% for each favorable vote on a bill. Abstentions are worth 50%, and unfavorable votes receive 0%. If a member was absent or did not hold office at the time of the vote (N/A), this does not affect their score. Votes on five of our sponsored bills (AB 22, AB 275, AB 289, SB 270, SB 411) are weighted to be worth double the value of non-sponsored bills. Our top priority bill (AB 438) is worth triple the value when factored into a legislator's overall score. Legislators who authored a bill proposed and sponsored by CSEA in 2021 receive an additional 5% towards their overall score.

2021 VOTING RECORD SUMMARY

AB 22 McCarty (D) – SPONSOR. Transitional Kindergarten

Expands transitional kindergarten to all 4-year-olds by the 2025-26 school year. This bill was introduced pursuant to Resolution 5 from CSEA’s 2019 Annual Conference. The contents of this bill were incorporated into AB 130 (Budget Trailer Bill) and signed into law. **Final Disposition of Bill: AB 130 Signed into law**

AB 275 Medina (D) – SPONSOR. Probationary Period Parity

Conforms the probationary period for community college classified employees working in non-merit districts with that of community college classified employees working in merit districts and in TK-12 districts from one year to six months. **Final Disposition of Bill: Signed into law**

AB 289 Calderon (D) – SPONSOR. Merit District Fair Elections

Ensures fairness in the election process when classified employees are voting to become a merit system. Specifically, ensures a secret ballot, provides classified representation on tabulation committees, ensures fair election communications, and clarifies that election procedures and processes are bargainable. This bill was introduced pursuant to Resolution 2 from CSEA’s 2020 Annual Conference. **Final Disposition of Bill: Signed into law**

AB 438 Reyes (D) – SPONSOR. Layoff Notice Parity

Creates layoff parity between classified staff and their certificated and administrative colleagues, standardizing the layoff process so all school employees receive the same March 15 layoff notice and hearing rights, regardless of job title. **Final Disposition of Bill: Signed into law**

SB 270 Durazo (D) – SPONSOR. Employee Contact List

Authorizes the Public Employment Relations Board (PERB) to assess penalties if an employer violates requirements to provide new-hire and bargaining-unit lists to an exclusive representative; requires the exclusive representative to notify the employer of the violation and, in specific instances, an opportunity to cure the violation; and requires PERB to award attorney’s fees to the prevailing party. **Final Disposition of Bill: Signed into law**

SB 411 Cortese (D) – SPONSOR. Work After Retirement

Authorizes the California Public Employee Retirement System to resolve inadvertent violations of work after retirement rules without requiring reinstatement into the system and repayment of earned retirement income. **Final Disposition of Bill: Signed into law**

AB 86 Committee on Budget – SUPPORT. Paraeducator and COVID-19 Related Funding for LEAs

Appropriates \$6.6 billion to incentivize local education agencies (LEAs) to reopen for in-person instruction. Specifically, \$2 billion for LEAs who reopen for in-person instruction by April 1, 2021, and \$4.6 billion for learning loss mitigation. The other major components of this bill include: a) requiring school districts to spend 10%, or \$456 million, of the learning loss grant for hiring additional paraeducators; reserving 10% of all COVID-19 vaccines for school employees; and allowing the \$2 billion in-person instruction grant to be spent on COVID-19 testing, personal protective equipment, cleaning, ventilation, salaries, social/mental support services, etc. **Final Disposition of Bill: Signed into law**

SB 95 **Skinner (D) – SUPPORT. COVID-19 Sick Leave**

Reestablishes the COVID-19 supplemental paid sick leave for employers with more than 25 employees and provides up to two weeks or 80 hours of COVID-19 supplemental leave to eligible employees, expiring September 30, 2021. **Final Disposition of Bill: Signed into law**
