
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 77% of LGBTQ teenagers report feeling depressed/down over the past week;

95% report trouble sleeping at night;

 >70% report feelings of worthlessness and hopelessness in the past week.


LGBT youth, 2015

LGB students are:

~5x more likely to report using illegal drugs

~4x more likely to have tried heroin

~5x more likely to have used injection drugs



Adolescent Suicide Behavior

American Journal of Pediatrics (Sept. 2018)

~ 14% of adolescents report a previous suicide attempt;

Transmale 50.8% Non-binary 41.8%

Transfemale 29.9%. Questioning 27.9%



More Congruence Healthier/Happier

Using a transgender youth's chosen name at work, at school, with friends, and at home:



reduces depression symptoms by

71%



reduces thoughts of suicide by


34%



reduces suicide attempts by

65%

You don't know what gender someone is by looking at them. If someone tells you who they are, believe them.



Third gender in India

Recorded presence going back 4,000 years



Muxe (pronounced Moo-Shay)

Indigenous Zapotec cultures of Oaxaca (southern Mexico)

A muxe is a person assigned male at birth who dresses and behaves in ways otherwise associated with women.





There are 55 countries in Africa. Across the continent, rigid gender binaries were introduced with European colonization.


In Nigeria, the Igboassigned gender based on a person's energy around age 5, not based on anatomy.

In Central Africa, the Mbuti don't assign gender until after puberty.




Two-Spirit is an umbrella term coined in 1990 at the 3rd annual spiritual gathering of Gay and Lesbian Native People. Nadleeh (Navajo), Kwido (Tewa), Winkte (Lakota), Dubuds (Paiute) and many more specific tribal identities form the Two-Spirit constellation.








What's your Gender?

What do you experience as being gender affirming?



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If Someone Comes Out To You:

- 1) Thank them for sharing!
- 2) Ask if it is okay for you to tell anyone else, and, if so, who. This is important so they can come out in their own time, in their own way, like they did with you.
- 3) Ask how you can support them. Would they like you to arrange a Gender Support Plan Meeting?

Interrupting Bias Scripts:

- 1) "That's offensive."
- 2) "That was not respectful; at this school, we treat everyone with respect."
- 3) "Stop. It is never okay to use that language at school."
- 4) "It is hurtful to talk about someone like that. Do you understand why?"
- 5) "It is never okay to put someone down because of who they love/how they express their gender"
- 6) "Their gender is none of your business." / "Their sexual orientation is none of your business."
- 7) "You've always seemed like a kind and caring person to me, but what you just said is mean and hurtful. That makes me wonder, what do you think that word means?"

*Easily adapted for other -isms and -obias too, for example a racist slur.
